Monday saw the first day of the Chinese New year, also known as the Spring Festival. In Chinese astrology, each year is associated with a zodiac animal sign. Similarly to its western counterpart, the Chinese zodiac is divided into 12 animals with each having a time-length of one year instead of one month. This year it is the Year of the Monkey with the next cycle of the monkey being in 2028! FEBRUARY PARENT/TEACHER MEET AND GREET

Parents and care givers are invited to attend a Parent/Teacher 'meet and greet' session scheduled for the week beginning Monday, 22 February. This initial meeting is designed to be a sharing of information about students between parents, students and teachers. Please note that these sessions are not the forum for updates on academic progress, rather an opportunity to share information about your child and how to best meet their social, academic and emotional needs. Learning Improvement Plan goals for students in Years 1

to 6 will be a feature of the discussion. Information will be distributed shortly providing information relating to dates for the meetings and procedure for bookings using the online booking system. If you are having problems accessing the site please contact the office who can assist you. I strongly encourage all parents to make themselves available for these sessions.

STUDENT FREE/CURRICULUM DAYS

Each year, government schools are provided with student free days for staff to participate in professional development, school planning, curriculum development and student assessment and reporting purposes. The Watsonia North School Council has approved the following dates for curriculum and planning purposes with students not required to attend school on these days:

- Friday 4 March 2016 Curriculum Day
- Monday 11 April 2016 Curriculum Day
- Monday 11 July 2016 Curriculum Day
- Tuesday 21 June Student Reporting Day (students only attend nominated interview time – see note below)

We ask that parents and carers make note of these dates in order to make suitable care arrangements for their child/children.

Parents/guardians are also advised that the **mid-year Parent/Teacher/Student Interviews will be conducted on Tuesday 21 June** and children will not be required to attend school on this day. They will however, be required to attend the interview with their parent/s or guardian/s and teacher.

SCHOOL COUNCIL

An information pack will be sent home on Friday regarding School Council Elections for this year. The School Council plays a crucial role in setting the future directions of the school, and I urge parents to consider nominating. Nominations forms are available from the office commencing Monday 15 February.

SCHOOL INJURIES AND INSURANCE

The Department does not hold accident insurance for school students, with parents and guardians generally responsible for paying the cost of medical treatment for injured students, including any transport costs. Most medical costs will be refundable by Medicare and if you are a member of an ambulance or health insurance fund, you may also be able to claim transport or other expenses from the fund. There are insurers that provide accident insurance policies for students. The Department however, cannot advise parents and guardians on whether to purchase a student accident policy or which policy to purchase, as individual families are likely to have differing needs. Parents' decisions may be affected by other insurance cover they hold, the extent to which their children participate in sports or other physical activities at school, and the particular disposition of their child/children.


