Term 2 is action packed and the following outline will give you a better understanding of the classroom programs.

PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT AND STUDENT WELLBEING:

- Revisit school values of WNPS: Respect, Understanding, Integrity, Responsibility and Excellence
- Group work protocols
- Whole body listening techniques for a variety of situations
- Continue homework routines and expectations

FNGLISH

WRITING:

- Information reports and procedures will be explicitly taught and developed
- Common nouns, proper nouns, adjectives and verbs revisited
- Victorian Modern Cursive: clockwise letters with rounded entry: Xx, Zz, Pp, Kk and anti-clockwise letters: Aa, Cc, Dd, Gg, Qq, Oo, and Ee
- Spelling: testing of the Magic Words/Demons/Challenge words which will form homework spelling tasks. Words with the 'Long e' sound (ee ea e-e e ei ie), consonant blends: fr/gr/dr/pr/br/tr and procedural words (verbs, adverbs, technical words) will be studied. Suffixes and prefixes (adding ing, es, s and dis or un) spelling generalisations (i before e except after c, drop the e to add ing, k sound can be c, k or ck) will be studied in spelling sessions.

READING:

- Guided Reading continues with a focus on non-fiction texts
- Take home reading continues
- Author Study Mem Fox books will be explored
- Weekly library visits to extend book selections

SPEAKING AND LISTENING

- Class expectations in small group and class tasks will be explored
- Share and Learn sessions continue with assessment using the public speaking rubric located in student's homework books

MATHEMATICS:

- Continue to revise counting by 1's, 2's, 5's and 10's up to and beyond 100
- Automatic recall of number facts up to 20
- Place value up to and beyond 1000
- Reading calendars
- 100 days of school maths activities
- Addition and subtraction concepts including money amounts
- Reading and writing time to the quarter hour
- Location
- 2D shapes and 3D object features
- Mass (how heavy an item is)
- Fractions (quarter, half and eighths)
- Length and area

ILIPs:

- Continue to evaluate progress of ILIP goals
- Set new goals throughout the term when previous goals have been achieved

HOMEWORK:

- Spelling words will be given each week
- Regular reading will be expected
- Maths or English levelled tasks will also be set
- Share and Learn presentations to be prepared every fortnight

INOUIRY: ARE WE THERE YET?

Students will continue their Australian studies through the Alison Lester book titled 'Are We There Yet?'

- Students will finish taking part in 'tuning in' activities relating to the different states and territories of Australia
- Specific thinking tools and organisers will be used to sort and find out information about Australia relating to states, people, habitats, sport and landmarks
- Guest speakers will be asked to come in and discuss various aspects of Australian studies
- Students will have the opportunity to devise their own question about Australia for investigation, if appropriate
