

From the Principal ANZAC DAY - MONDAY 25 APRIL

On Monday, we will pause as a nation to remember and honour the memory of the thousands of young men who lost their lives in what has become to be known as the ANZAC legend. Due to the special significance of the day, it is declared as a national public holiday and there will be no school on this day.

On Friday, Year 3 to 6 students and staff will be involved in a special ANZAC ceremony here at school commencing at 12:00 noon on the basketball court near the Performing Arts Centre. We will take time to reflect on the sacrifices made by those who served our country and we invite family members to join us on the day.

WE WANT OUR STUDENTS TO TELL US WHAT THEY THINK

Our school is conducting a survey to find out what your child thinks of our school. The *Attitudes to School survey* is an annual survey for Years 5 to 12 students offered by the Department of Education and Training. It is designed to assist schools in gaining an understanding of students' perceptions and experience of school. Our school will use the survey results to plan programs and activities to improve your child's experience at school.

Students in Year 5 and 6 will participate in this year's survey. All responses to the survey are anonymous. This year the Attitudes to School survey will be conducted at our school over the period Monday 18 April to Friday 29 April. The survey only takes 20-30 minutes to complete and occurs during your child's class time. The survey results will be reported back to the school at the end of July. Teachers will unpack the results to ensure we continue to provide a safe, caring and nurturing environment. Please speak to your child's teacher if you would like more information.
