# VOLUNTEERING AT SCHOOL & WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECK (WWC)

The Working with Children (WWC) Check is part of Victorian law and provides a minimum checking standard set for individuals who work with children, either on a paid or voluntary basis.

Under the WWC Act 2005, schools need to ensure that people in roles that have direct, unsupervised contact with children have a WWC check and this includes parent helpers and volunteers.

Generally, parents who assist in the day to day activities at our school do so under the guidance and supervision of staff, however we strongly encourage all parent helpers and volunteers to have a current WWC check.

There is no cost involved for volunteers in obtaining the WWC Check and applications can be lodged online by visiting <a href="https://www.workingwithchildren.vic.gov.au">www.workingwithchildren.vic.gov.au</a>

To assist individuals in applying for the WWC, we have organised for Jill and Des in the office to make themselves available on Monday 29 February from 9:30 until 10:30am to help lodge online applications. Please call into the office during this time to complete an online application.

The school maintains a register of parents who have successfully applied and obtained a WWC check. This being the case, we ask parents who already have a current WWC, to bring their card to the office so that we may obtain a copy and file for our records and future reference.





